Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! These are the words that we have exclaimed during our Easter worship services and we continue to claim them, as Easter is not just one day, but continues for fifty days, liturgically speaking anyway.

Our Easter worship services were wonderful, despite the snow following the late service! Unlike, the disciples who gathered later in a locked room, wondering, what should they be doing, we too might be asking the same question following Easter Sunday. Now what?

Now what? A great question that can be looked at either with enthusiasm or in dismay. I would hope that we look at "Now what?" with enthusiasm!!! The Lord has risen for you and for me and for that we should not only be highly appreciative, but we should also be filled with enthusiasm, because you see, it was not, is not the end, but a new beginning!

Christ not only died and rose again overcoming death and forgiving our sins, but he empowered us with the Holy Spirit. On May 29th we will observe Ascension Sunday, (always 40 days after Easter, 10 days prior to Pentecost but always on a Thursday. Since we do not worship on Thursday, we move Ascension to the following Sunday.).

Ascension Day marks the day, according to Acts 1:11, when Jesus ascended into heaven, however, not before Jesus assured his disciples that they would be accompanied by the Holy Spirit. "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria. And to the ends of the earth. (Acts 1:8)"

In other words, "What's next?" Just as the disciples were empowered by the Holy Spirit, we too are empowered and called to continue to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ to all the ends of the world

Easter services are over. The liturgical season of Easter will soon be over, (June 5^{th} with the observance of Pentecost - the receiving of the Holy Spirit). However, through our baptism we remain as Easter people, believers of the resurrected Lord and that my friends is the answer to the question, "What's next?" We are called to continue to share the Good News of Jesus Christ in our daily living, in whatever ways we are gifted and capable of doing!

Do you like music? Do you like the shore?

Why not join us on July 10, 2022 following our 9:15 a.m. worship service to take the bus to experience this wonderful event? Feel free to invite family and friends, too! We will leave Jordan promptly at 11:00 a.m. and return around 11:00 p.m. When we arrive in Ocean Grove you will have free afternoon time.

- OCEAN GROVE -- otherwise known as GOD'S SQUARE MILE, has more Victorian homes than Cape May. Enjoy the afternoon strolling the town, sunbathing (beach wrist band is \$10, under 11 yrs free), or exploring the boardwalk and shops. OCEAN GROVE is a *dry* community. If you wish to enjoy an adult beverage, you may walk across the lake on one of the bridges into Asbury Park. Lunch & dinner is on your own you may want to consider calling ahead on this busy weekend.
- ASBURY PARK -- a half mile walk on the Boardwalk. See the Stone Pony of Bruce Springsteen fame.
- CHOIR FESTIVAL -- Since its debut in 1955 the Ocean Grove Choir Festival has remained one of the most popular sacred music events of the Mid-Atlantic region. This annual festival is held in July and features hundreds of singers, exciting guest conductors, a brass ensemble, and a magnificent pipe organ. The Great Auditorium is a historic building, built in 1894, a beautiful wooden structure. It's a wonderful event for guests of all ages. The concert is free!! A free will offering will be accepted midway through the performance. Concert begins at 7:00 p.m. & is approximately 1 1/2 hours in length. We will leave to come home immediately following the concert (around 8:30 p.m.).

What's it like to be a Pastoral Intern in NEPA?

It is hard to believe I have been on internship with Common Ground Recovery Community for nine months already! My time with Common Ground has been a deep blessing to me and to my education. I have witnessed the presence of God in the open vulnerable sharing during our Wednesday worship, in the heartfelt reverent "thank you's" when serving communion and meals in downtown Reading and in our study of the scriptures and 12-steps. Common Ground truly is a place of radical love and where God's grace embraces our brokenness.

As part of my internship project, I invited our worshiping communities and ministry partners to reflect on these three questions: What does Common Ground mean to you? What does community mean to you? And where do you see God here and in the world? They then drew on white cotton squares that will be sewn together to make an altar cloth to fit all of our communion tables. The responses were profound and beautiful!

There are drawings of stick figures holding hands around the globe, animals peacefully living together, a place of refuge in the storm and in the desert, flowers, hearts, and crosses. There are phrases like, "Freedom, break the chains", "God is love", "We are better together", "Never give up hope because there is hope in everything", and so much more on these 33 squares!

As these squares are knit together to make one, we are reminded that God weaves all of us together in a tapestry of love to bring warmth, comfort, grace, and peace to a weary world! May we live out this good news and may it spill over into thanksgiving! (Colossians 2:2-7)




