Dear Siblings in Christ,

I hope you are enjoying your summer, albeit it is a hot one! I am beginning to understand the saying, "The older you get, the faster the time goes!" It feels like we just completed the spring season with the celebration of Confirmation, and yet here we are only a month away before we return to the fall schedule. This means there has been a lot of planning going on behind the scenes. And it feels really good! It feels like the church is alive again as it was pre-covid!

This coming fall will bring the usual programming of Confirmation classes and Sunday School class opportunities for both our young people and our "young at heart" adults. On Sundays, the adult class "Circle of Faith" will resume meeting to explore season four of "The Chosen." The Tuesday night Bible Study class will be exploring the Book of Exodus.

Our music program will be back in full swing with the various choirs, handbells and chimes, again for both the young and the "young at heart." The awesome thing is that you do not need to read music to participate!

On September 8<sup>th</sup> we will return to both worship service times 8 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. with Sunday School at 9:15 a.m. While the members of this congregation hold dearly to these two worship service times for a variety of reasons, there is concern which, with your help, can easily be overcome. I thank each of you who assist in whatever way you are already involved in the worship services.

However, there are others who are not involved and could easily help lessen the burden for those who are carrying several hats during the worship services. I am asking that if you are able to assist in the areas needed for worship service, to please contact the coordinator's name in the bulletin and volunteer for the following areas: lector (a fancy name that means to read the lessons/prayers); usher/greeter; altar guild(sets up the altar and assistS during communion); bell ringer; videographers (run the video during services. It's so easy several of our youth assist.). SAT (Safety Awareness Team – help secure the doors before and after services, bring in traffic cones). In addition, it would be awesome to have one or two people per service to oversee the fellowship time after each service. Make it a family Sunday commitment!

None of these aforementioned responsibilities take a lot of time and there is always training available. As the Apostle Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 12: 4-11: "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of services but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the spirit is given for some benefit."

I am asking you to prayerfully consider giving a small amount of your time on Sunday mornings to assist with the responsibilities of the worship service. Please let Monica in the church office know of your interest or please speak to me if you have any questions or reach out to one of the coordinators.
